Lessons, Clinics & Camps

My philosophy is that anyone who handles a horse is a horse trainer – horses learn from every interaction they have. Whether you as a handler are a good trainer is the question. A good trainer produces quiet, trustworthy, respectful horses that are responsive, not reactive.

I have been training horses for most of my life, now it is time to start training trainers.

Lessons:

I offer riding & training lessons to all levels of riders & handlers. My focus is on safety and communication. It is important to consider every situation from the horse's perspective in order to understand the most effective way of dealing with problems. Often the problem is not with the horse, but the approach of the handler.

Barefoot Trimming

Horses were given feet made for travelling all types of terrain, meant to be cared for by Nature alone. Through domestication we have inhibited Nature's ability to care for our horse's feet, and through many years of "tradition" we have strayed far from natural hoof care. Well, it's coming back.

Contrary to popular belief, most horses do quite well without shoes if they are kept on a good program of non-invasive, balanced barefoot trimming & conditioning, and most problems can be solved with a good balanced trim.

I have been trimming hooves for 18 years. I have dealt with a variety of pathologies and am focusing on natural hoof care, assisting Nature rather than working against her.
